

HIGH RESOLUTION ANOSCOPY (HRA) PREP	
1 DAY BEFORE	<ul> <li>DO NOT put any creams or medications into your anus</li> <li>DO NOT insert toys, fingers, or other objects into your anus</li> <li>DO NOT douche or use enemas</li> <li>DO NOT have receptive anal sex</li> </ul>
MEDICATIONS	<ul> <li>If you are taking Medicines That Thin Your Blood: Contact your provider to discuss any adjustments that might be required         <ul> <li>Medications include but are not limited to Aspirin, Plavix, Coumadin, Lovenox, Eliquis, Xarelto</li> </ul> </li> <li>If you are taking Aspirin: Do not hold it pre-procedure. Please take it the morning of your procedure with a small sip of water.</li> <li>If you are taking Blood Pressure Medication: Do not hold them pre-procedure. Take them the morning of your procedure with a small sip of water.</li> <li>If you are taking Diabetes Medications: Contact your prescribing doctor to discuss adjustments the day before and the day of your procedure</li> </ul>
PROCEDURE DAY	<ul> <li>DO NOT DOUCHE OR USE ENEMAS         <ul> <li>Doing so can make it too difficult to see and we may not be able to do the procedure</li> </ul> </li> <li>8 HOURS PRIOR: STOP EATING         <ul> <li>You can consume clear liquids up until 3 hours before the test</li> <li>Clear liquids include iced/hot tea, black coffee, clear broth, apple or white grape juice (without pulp), gingerale, jello, ice pops</li> </ul> </li> <li>3 HOURS PRIOR:         <ul> <li>STOP CLEAR LIQUIDS. No candy or gum either</li> </ul> </li> <li>Take your regular medications in the morning with sips of water</li> <li>Failure to follow these instructions may result in a delay or cancellation of your procedure</li> </ul>
ARRIVAL	<ul> <li>Arrive 30 minutes prior to your procedure, no later!</li> <li>Bring list of current medications including doses</li> <li>Bring a Photo ID</li> <li>Bring Insurance Card</li> <li>Bring any applicable Referrals</li> <li>Please do not bring any valuables</li> </ul>

<b>ESCORT</b> •	Please ensure that you have an escort (responsible adult over the age of 18) to pick you up at the end of the procedure
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## WHAT TO EXPECT POST PROCEDURE

- You are expected to have post procedure anal pressure. This can last for a few days.
- For control of pressure, use over the counter Tylenol 325mg, 1-2 tabs every 8 hours as needed, for the first several days.
- Most patients DO NOT experience pain. Just in case you have pain, your health care provider may prescribe pain control medication.
  - o If you are one of the few patients who requires pain control medication make sure to bring the rest of your prescription bottle to your follow up appointments.
- Spotting of blood may occur for the first few days after your procedure.
- Delayed bleeding can occur, usually 1-2 weeks post procedure, when the tissue heals and the scabs from the procedure site start to shed. This is expected.
